

SPANISH MOBILITY

1st -7th March 2020

With the consensus we planned in our first meeting in Birmingham we had our second mobility to Ave Maria Casa Madre in the city of Granada in the first week of March.

On the first day of our meeting all the partners were ready at school in line with the project agenda sent by our host school. We had a warm welcoming ceremony of our host school and then started our programme by making presentations of the partners school and our educational system to the group to get more information about the education that takes place in different countries. It was a very fruitful meeting and we had the chance to talk about our schools and the system interactively.

We attended in different levels of classes in the host school where we observed the teaching environment. We learnt how and who the school was founded and their goals in teaching. Teachers from all countries had the opportunity to observe the outdoor activities implemented in the host school on-site.

In the meeting, we talked about what to be shared on our official websites. All partners would be in charge of sending the powerpoint presentations of their schools, education systems and gender issue in their countries to be shared on the website.

For starting the project in our schools we are responsible for teaching our kids about how to carry around the discussions and the ethics of a discussion. After empowering these ethics the kids will discuss how expectations around gender roles impact on kids' lives and those of their peers. Moreover, they would discuss on what roles, behaviours, activities our society considers appropriate for men and women. We also decided on what activities to follow until the 3rd mobility to Poland. We went over the details of the Polish mobility on 20th- 26th September.

We spent the whole day in presenting our societies' point of view on "Gender". It was an interactive workshop in which all partners discussed on and learnt more about women/ men roles, responsibilities and the societies' points of view on gender issue.

We lived a week in Granada with Spanish culture and cuisine. We visited the landmarks and touristic places in Granada such as Palace of Alhambra, Granada Cathedral and Sacramento. As a group we joined a flamenco night and had an outstanding experience of Spanish traditional dance and music.
